Masha Orlovich was born in St. Petersburg (former Leningrad), Russia. She graduated from the Serov College of Fine Art. In 1990, Masha moved to Israel and settled down in Safed. She is a member of the Israel Painters and Sculptors Association (from 2000) and the Japan International Watercolor Institute (from 2021).

The artist works with watercolors and various printing techniques, such as etching and monotype. She creates urbanistic landscape, still life, nudes and inter-genre compositions.

St. Petersburg Museum of Sculpture and other museums in Israel, Europe and USA, as well as private collectors, including Maxim Vengerov and Daniel Barenboim, have collected some of Masha's artworks. They are also represented in numerous catalogues. Masha won the Excellence Award in Printed Graphics at the "Enter into Art" exhibition (Königswinter, Germany, 2021).
